WHEREAS, Martin Luther King, Jr. was one of the greatest civil rights leaders in America whose words and actions inspired generations of Americans to examine their personal beliefs and come to the realization that all people are created equal and there is strength and richness in diversity; and

WHEREAS, Martin Luther King, Jr.'s life has impacted people all across America but it has not yet been closely examined to see what his life has meant to Lane County; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Pete Sorenson has put together a program to examine this question and the program will include musicians at a cost of \$300; and

WHEREAS, it now appears to the Board of Commissioners that a transfer of \$300 from the Operational Contingency to Materials and Services within the General Fund is necessary to provide sufficient funds to help support the proposed event: and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioner, as per ORS 294.450(1), has authority to transfer appropriations within a fund if appropriations are moved from one organizational unit or appropriation to another; and

WHEREAS, the need, the purpose and the amount of the transfer are herein described;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that \$300 be transferred from the General Fund Operational Contingency to the Materials and Services appropriation within General Expense for the "What Martin Luther King Jr. Means to Lane County" event.
