

**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT**  
**FOR**  
**PUBLIC SAFETY COORDINATING COUNCIL**

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by and between Lane County, a political subdivision of the State of Oregon, hereinafter referred to as "County," and the City of Eugene, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Eugene," and the City of Springfield, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Springfield."

**RECITALS:**

- A. WHEREAS, ORS 190.010 and the Lane County Home Rule Charter provide that units of local government may enter into agreements for the performance of any or all functions and activities that a party to the agreements, its officers or agents, have authority to perform, and
  
- B. WHEREAS, a balanced and effective criminal justice system in Lane County is an important component to the perception and reality of community safety for residents, and

- I. WHEREAS, an intergovernmental agreement was signed in 2001 between the three governing jurisdictions that designated the Public Safety Coordinating Council as the appropriate planning body to ensure coordination, reduction of duplication and ongoing monitoring of the criminal justice system; and
  
- J. WHEREAS, in 2003 due to severe financial constraints, the State of Oregon reduced funding for Community Corrections and youth programs, negatively impacting numerous public safety programs throughout Lane County, and
  
- K. WHEREAS, in response to this reduction from the State, it became necessary to restructure the Public Safety Coordinating Council to make it more efficient, and
  
- L. WHEREAS, even with the reorganization, the three governing bodies of Eugene, Springfield and Lane County believe it is critical that elected representatives of Eugene and Springfield continue on the Public Safety Coordinating Council, in order to continue an intergovernmental coordination and system analysis of our public safety system.

NOW, THEREFORE THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- The Supervisory Authority Team, a body created by the BCC, will produce the Community Corrections Plan including the state resource plan to serve the local offender population for review by the Public Safety Coordinating Council (including the CCA budget and budget modifications)
- DPPA work will continue as Task Force work with specific work plan and time bound items (including the management of IDM2 grant)

Members of the Community Safety Committee will include:

- Members of Supervisory Authority Team (Jail Commander, Judge, Director of Community Corrections)
- Lane County Courts Representative
- Public Defender
- District Attorney (or designee)
- Lay Member
- Service Provider (non-voting on budget matters)

**Juvenile Committee** – The function of this committee is also to address state mandates to coordinate plans to serve the needs of the juvenile offender population including prevention, treatment, education, employment resources and intervention strategies. The overarching goal of this work should be to a) design a coordinated system for juvenile offenders based on best practices, b) develop plans for state

- Representative from Domestic Violence Council

4. **Task Forces** – The opportunity to address specific community safety problems and expand participation in both the adult and juvenile work will occur via time-limited task forces to be appointed by the Public Safety Coordinating Council. These groups will be developed as needed to accomplish defined tasks.

Task force members can be broader than the Public Safety Coordinating Council members in order to augment expertise as required by topic area.

- **Initial Task Force** – Initially the Public Safety Coordinating Council shall appoint a task force to address the FTA (Failure to Appear) issue. Within six months time, the group should at a minimum 1) develop a measurable statement(s) of the problem including costs and 2) make prioritized recommendations for fact based solutions to this problem including costs and benefits, 3) arrive at broad committee consensus for solutions and priorities. Members shall include:
  - Police Chiefs – Eugene and Springfield
  - Jail Commander
  - Community Corrections
  - District Attorney (or representative from DA's office)

The application provisions of the Lane Manual setting forth standard provisions for public contracts (LM 21.130) are incorporated by this reference as if fully set forth herein.
