Current Year Budget Changes

Since FY 17-18 Budget Adoption, the following changes to the Department budget have occurred:

- 17-19 Biennium:
 - Increase in Community Corrections Act (CCA) revenues
 - Increase Justice Reinvestment Grant Program (JRGP) revenues.
 - Increased staff by 1.0 Office Assistant, 1.0 Corrections Tech, 2.0 Parole Officers and 1.0 Supervisor.







18-19 EXPENDITURES
