



Affidavit for Service Dog License Fee Waiver

Lane County Animal Services provides for waiver of dog license fees for bona fide service dogs upon submission of a signed affidavit by the owner that a dog qualifies as a service dog.

A **service dog** is defined by the U.S. Dept. of Justice and the Lane County Code as a dog that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disability. The work or tasks performed by a service animal must be directly related to the handler's disability. However, the crime deterrent effects of an animal's presence and the provision of emotional support, well-being, comfort, or companionship do not constitute work or tasks for the purposes of this definition.

You do not need to detail the person's disability, provide medical documentation or a special identification card or training documentation for the dog, or demonstrate the dog's ability to perform the work or task.

To qualify for the dog license fee waiver, please answer the following questions and sign below. This document will constitute an affidavit that a dog meets the definition of a service dog and qualifies for a fee waiver.
