

# Glenwood Recycling Instructions spring 2020

Is it recyclable? Ask Garbage Guru [www.lanecountyor.gov/garbageguru](http://www.lanecountyor.gov/garbageguru)

All materials are collected separately. Follow these instructions.

## Aluminum

— YES —

- Lids & labels OK
- Rinse
- All containers must be 100% empty



— NO —

- Dirty materials
- Shiny or flexible plastic pouches

## Antifreeze—Place on cart

— YES —

- Household only
- Store in unbreakable containers with secure lid
- Maximum 15 gallons per day



— NO —

- Contaminants (oil, fuel)
- Original containers are NOT recyclable
- Commercial or farm

## Auto Batteries

All types & sizes of auto & other lead-acid batteries

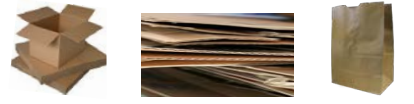
— YES —



## Corrugated Cardboard & Brown Paper Bags

— YES —

- Look for wavy inner layer
- Any color corrugated cardboard
- Flatten all boxes



— NO —

- Waxed cardboard
- Packaging material
- Pizza boxes

## Appliances Freon containing

ALL SITES EXCEPT SHARPS CREEK

— YES —

- Refrigerators, air conditioners, freezers & heat pumps (all units with Freon)
- Do not cut cords or drain Freon



— NO —

- Commercial units
- No food

## Electronic Waste

— YES —

- Maximum 7 items per visit
- TVs, computer monitors & CPU's
- Printers, keyboards, printers, mice
- Stereos, VCRs, DVDs, cell phones



— NO —

- Commercial or floor-standing copiers
- Parts, dismantled or salvaged units
- Speakers, reel-to-reel, or packaging

## Fluorescent Lamps

— YES —

- Household Only
- Maximum 10 bulbs
- Some ballasts



— NO —

- Incandescent bulbs
- Broken bulbs
- Lamps taped together

## Glass Jars & Bottles

— YES —

- Bottles & jars only
- Rinse
- Lids & labels OK



— NO —

- Drinking glass
- Pyrex
- Window glass
- Lightbulbs
- Broken glass

ITEMS RECYCLED FOR A FEE

## Propane Tanks & Disposable helium tanks

— YES —

- Maximum size 5 gal
- Propane only
- 1-lb camping-free



— NO —

- Other compressed gas cylinders

## Household Batteries

— YES —

- All button, rechargeable & ni-cad
- All Lithium, silver oxide & mercury batteries



— NO —

- Alkaline batteries made after 1996 sizes AAA-D (OK to toss in garbage)
- Commercial or industrial batteries

## Milk Jugs & other HDPE # 2 bottles / jugs (no color)

— YES —

- Rinse
- Remove caps/lids



— NO —

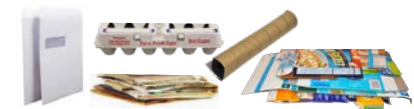
- Solid white jugs



## Mixed Paper

— YES —

- Remove samples & plastic from junk mail
- Flatten boxes



— NO —

- Plates, cups, napkins
- Frozen food boxes or to-go or boxes
- Tissue, diapers, or paper towels



## Wood Waste

— YES —

- Lumber, pallets, most wood products
- Broken furniture, painted wood
- Wood with nails or screws
- Particle board



— NO —

- Foam core, Formica or plastic coated
- Hardware bigger than your thumb
- MDF/pressed paper board
- Railroad ties
- Pressure treated wood



## Motor Oil — Place on cart Oil Filters — Place in drum

— YES —

- Household only — Maximum 15 gallons
- Store in unbreakable containers with secure lid



— NO —

- PCB's, water, brake fluid, contaminants
- Gasoline, diesel, solvents
- Business or commercial farms
- Empty motor oil containers are NOT recyclable

## Newspaper

— YES —

- All newspaper, ads & paper inserts



— NO —

- Plastic wrappers or bags
- Rubber bands
- Non-paper samples or promotions

## Paint

— YES —

- Household Only
- 20 gallons maximum
- Measured in can size - not liquid contents



— NO —

- Commercial sources
- Industrial coatings
- Automotive paints, tars or adhesives
- Empty containers
- Rusty cans or illegible labels

## Yard Debris

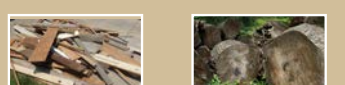
— YES —

- Grass, brush, leaves, garden debris
- Limbs under 12" diameter



— NO —

- Bagged materials
- Lumber, stumps or root wads
- Limbs over 12" diameter



## Scrap Metal

— YES —

- All items that are 75% metal or more
- All drums/barrels must have large visible holes



— NO —

- Liquids/fluids
- Refrigerators, freezers, water coolers, heat pumps, air conditioners or dehumidifiers
- Pressurized containers



## Sharps (Needles) Lancets & other medical sharps

— YES —

- Household only
- Must be in rigid red sealed container with lid (red laundry detergent container OK)
- Make sure lid is secure



— NO —

- Other containers such as glass, milk jugs, coffee cans or non-rigid containers
- Material from medical facilities or other businesses

## Tin & Steel Cans

— YES —

- Lids & labels OK
- Rinse
- All containers must be 100% empty



Tip: Magnets attract tin/steel cans, not aluminum

— NO —

- Dirty containers
