ORDER NO. 15-06-02-08

IN THE MATTER OF SETTING A PUBLIC HEARING
FOR THE PROPOSED SURRENDER OF A
PORTION OF GLENWOOD BOULEVARD (COUNTY
ROAD NUMBER 2114) AND EAST 17TH AVENUE
(COUNTY ROAD NUMBER 1728) TO THE CITY OF
SPRINGFIELD (17-03-34 & 18-03-03)

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield, by Resolution 2015-10 dated April 20, 2015 has requested the jurisdiction over a portion of Glenwood Boulevard (County Road No. 2114) and East 17^h Avenue (County Road No. 1728) be transferred to the City of Springfield; and;

WHEREAS, this transfer comes as the final action of an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with the City of Springfield authorized in 2011. This IGA facilitated improvements to both County and City facilities to mitigate the use of Glenwood Boulevard as a detour route during the Oregon department of Transportation Willamette River Bridge construction project. All improvements were completed during the summer of 2014; and

WHEREAS, the portion of Glenwood Boulevard herein proposed for surrender extends from the southerly right of way of Franklin Boulevard (State Highway 126, Business Route), thence southerly approximately 0.37 miles to that portion of Glenwood Boulevard that is currently under the City of Springfield's jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the portion of East 17th Ave extends from the westerly right of way of Glenwood Boulevard, thence westerly approximately 0.10 miles to its westerly terminus, being the entrance to the Lane County Solid Waste Central Receiving Station; and

WHEREAS, the portion of Glenwood Boulevard and East 17^h Avenue proposed for surrender, lies entirely within the city limits of Springfield; and

WHEREAS, ORS 373.270 provides for the surrender and transfer of jurisdiction over county roads within a city, the county may transfer jurisdiction over county roads or parts thereof within a city when it is considered to be necessary, expedient, or in the best interest of the county to do so; and the governing body of the city deems it necessary or expedient and in the best interest of the city to acquire jurisdiction over the county roads or portions thereof and to the same extent as it has over public streets and alleys of the city; and

WHEREAS, the Public Works Director of Lane County has recommended a public hearing date be established to consider the offer of surrender to Springfield, these portions of county roads as described in Exhibit "A", and has provided a written report attached hereto and made a part hereof by this Order, and marked as Exhibit "B"; and

WHEREAS, the Board is of the opinion that setting a date to hold a public hearing is in the best interest of the public; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of Lane County **ORDERS** as follows:

1. That a public hearing be set for July 14, 2015 at 1:30 p.m., at the Lane County Courthouse, 125 East 8th Avenue, Eugene, Oregon, to formally consider the surrender of a portion of Glenwood Boulevard (County Road Number 2114) and East 17th Avenue, (County Road Number 1728), as described in Exhibit "A", attached and made a part of this Order, to the City of Springfield;
2. That legal notice of hearing be posted or published, in accordance with ORS 373.270;
3. That the Director of the Lane County Department of Public Works prepare and provide a final report on the proposed surrender.

EXHIBIT "A"

LEGAL DESCRIPTION

MILEAGE

GLENWOOD BOULEVARD (COUNTY ROAD NUMBER 2114)

0.37

All that portion of Glenwood Boulevard (County Road Number 2114) from the southerly right of way of Franklin Boulevard (State Highway 126, Business Route), thence southerly 1950 feet, more or less, to that portion of Glenwood Boulevard that is under the City of Springfield's jurisdiction, being along the southerly boundary of that property annexed into the City of Eugene by Final Order 910, File C EU 89-10 and later transferred to the City of Springfield by Final Order 1146, File C SP 99-07. The portion of Glenwood Boulevard described herein is in Section 34, Township 17 South, Range 3 West and Section 3, Township 18 South, Range 3 West of the Willamette Meridian, Lane County, Oregon.

EAST 17th AVENUE (COUNTY ROAD NUMBER 1728)

0.10

All that portion of East 17th Avenue (County Road Number 1728) from the westerly right of way of Glenwood Boulevard, thence westerly approximately 520 feet to its westerly terminus. The portion of East 17th Avenue described herein is in Section 34, Township 17 South, Range 3 West of the Willamette Meridian, Lane County, Oregon.

DIRECTOR'S PRELIMINARY

(COUNTY ROAD NUMBER 1728) TO THE CITY OF
SPRINGFIELD (17-03-34 & 18-03-03)

The City of Springfield has adopted Resolution Number 2015-10, dated April 20, 2015, formally requesting the transfer of jurisdiction of a portion of Glenwood Boulevard (County Road No. 2114) and East 17^h Avenue (County Road No. 1728) within their city limits.


This transfer comes as the final action of an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with the City of Springfield authorized in 2011. This IGA facilitated improvements to both County and City facilities to mitigate the use of Glenwood Boulevard as a detour route during the Oregon department of Transportation Willamette River Bridge construction project. All improvements were completed during the summer of 2014.

The portions of roads consists of approximately 0.47 miles of right of way and is described on Exhibit "A", attached to and made a part of the Order setting a public hearing on the proposed surrender of said roads. The subject portions of roads is currently under the jurisdiction of Lane County, and the transfer of jurisdiction over these county roads would enable the City to maintain, develop, and improve the roads to the City's own specifications, standards, and timetables.

ORS 373.270 provides for the transfer of jurisdiction over county roads within a city. The county may transfer jurisdiction over county roads or portions thereof within a city when it is considered to be necessary, expedient, or in the best interest of the county to do so; and the governing body of the city deems it necessary or expedient and for the best interest of the city to acquire jurisdiction over the county roads, or portions thereof, to the same extent as it has over public streets and alleys of the city.

It is recommended the Order be approved setting a public hearing on the proposed surrender of jurisdiction of the portions of county roads as described in Exhibit "A" of said Order.
