ORDER NO: 20-07-28-03

IN THE MATTER OF CREATING A
TEMPORARY SPEED REDUCTION ON
BEAVER STREET AND HUNSAKER LANE
FROM MP 0.00 TO MP 1.141

WHEREAS, ORS 810.180(8) enables a road authority to establish by order a temporary designated speed that is lower than the statutory speed when, in the judgment of the road authority, the temporary designated speed is necessary to protect the safety of the public when temporary conditions constitute a danger.


WHEREAS, the Lane County Traffic Engineer has determined that a temporary speed reduction from 35 miles per hour (mph) to 30 mph y on Beaver Street and from 35 mph to 25 mph on Hunsaker Lane is necessary to protect the safety of the public during the temporary conditions which will commence in August 2020 with the creation of a wide shoulder through pavement markings and vertical delineators next to the vehicle travel lane which will be reduced from 11 to 10 feet for eastbound traffic.

WHEREAS, consistent with ORS 810.180(8), which limits temporary speeds to a specific period of time rather than the establishment of a permanent designated speed, the temporary speed reduction will remain in effect until August 2022.at which time the Oregon Department of Transportation will conduct a speed zone investigation to determine the permanent speed.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of County Commissioners of Lane County **ORDERS and RESOLVES** as follows:

1. The designated speed will temporarily be reduced to 30 mph for Beaver Street and 25 mph for Hunsaker Lane.
2. This temporary speed applies to all vehicles effective August 1, 2020 to August 1, 2022.
