IN THE MATTER OF ACCEPTING THE MENTAL HEALTH COURT GRANT WITH THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF JUSTICE PROGRAMS, BUREAU OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE, IN THE

AMOUNT OF \$149,999 FOR FY 2003-2005.

I. MOTION

TO ACCEPT THE MENTAL HEALTH COURT GRANT WITH THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF JUSTICE PROGRAMS, BUREAU OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$149,999 FOR FY 2003-2005.

II. ISSUE OR PROBLEM

The U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance, has approved the grant application for funding the FY 2003-2005 Mental Health Court in the amount of \$149,999. Lane County Board of Commissioners approved the application for these grant funds through Board Order 02-8-28-8. Lane County Health & Human Services is seeking approval from the Board of Commissioners for Lane County to accept these grant funds.

III. DISCUSSION

A. <u>Background / Analysis</u>

The purpose of this award is to fund a Mental Health Court demonstration project that mobilizes communities to implement innovative, collaborative efforts to bring system-wide improvements in the way they address offenders with mental disabilities or illnesses. Central to the service delivery system are the case manager and ongoing judicial supervision. Community involvement should include, but not be limited to the education system, the recreational system, mental health systems, drug and alcohol treatment programs and employment and housing assistance. Through this grant program, the goal is to decrease the offender's frequency of contact with the criminal justice system by improving his

or her social functioning through stable employment, housing, treatment and support services.

This grant supports the development and establishment of a Mental Health Court which will serve 35 offenders with mental health problems. Under this grant's guidelines, offenders with a dual-diagnosis of mental health and substance abuse problems will be referred to an existing program. The Mental Health Court will divert offenders from jail to treatment, under the supervision of the special Mental Health Court.

The grant will provide the following:

<u>H&HS 1.0 Mental Health Specialist</u> – Case manager who will manage clients referred to the Mental Health Court, serve as court liaison for these cases, facilitate the Case Teams, which will meet to staff cases, and provide individual and group counseling to court clients. A match of .25 FTE will be provided by Oregon Health Plan coverage.

Jail .20 FTE; Mental Health Specialist – Will screen and assess inmates post booking in jail into the diversion program and negotiate release with the District Attorney and Public Defender as is done currently for co-occurring disorder (COD) court participants. The new Mental Health Court will require some of their time for these responsibilities, thus .20 FTE will be provided as match to help divert these inmates from the jail to treatment.

Lane Council of Governments (LCOG) Program Evaluation – Process, input, and outcome evaluation will be provided by LCOG via an intergovernmental agreement with Lane County for ten percent of the grant funded portion of the budget (\$14,999).

<u>Travel and Training</u> – The grant requires funds be budgeted for two people to attend grantee conferences each year in Washington, DC.

<u>Client Support Fund</u> — This fund will provide need-based resources for short-term housing expenses (first/last months' rent, utility hookups, etc.), clothing, medication, as needed, to help stabilize clients as they transition back into the community and establish a means of long-term support. Resources will also be set aside for any necessary additional treatment or assessment costs which cannot be covered with other funding streams due to eligibility or lack of resources.

Fringe Benefits, Risk Management, Telephone Costs, Information Services, and County Indirect are prorated between grant funds and match since they are calculated based on FTE.

Lane County Board of Commissioners approved the application of the grant through Board Order 02-8-28-8. Lane County was notified on May 7, 2003 that the application for Mental Health Court funds in the amount of \$149,999 has been approved. These funds will be appropriated in the FY 2003-2005 budget. Lane County Health & Human Services will be the lead agent for the Mental Health Court grant. Representatives from Lane County Mental Health, Lane County District Attorney's Office, Sheriff's Office, Circuit Court, and LCOG will form the team to implement this grant. Anticipated start-up date will be July 1, 2003.

B. Alternatives / Options

- 1. Accept the grant from the U.S. Department of Justice in the amount of \$149,999 for FY 2003-2005 and delegate authority to the County Administrator to sign and date the attached grant award signature page and sign an intergovernmental agreement with LCOG for program evaluation services in the amount of \$14,999.
- 2. Do not accept the grant from the U.S. Department of Justice in the amount of \$149,999 for FY 2003-2005 and delegate authority to the County Administrator to sign and date the attached grant award signature page and not sign an intergovernmental agreement with LCOG for program evaluation services in the amount of \$14,999.

C. Recommendation

To approve item one above. Lane County's experience with court supervised diversion has been positive and Mental Health Courts are being recognized nationwide as promising approaches.

IV. IMPLEMENTATION

Upon approval by the Board, the grant will be implemented by representatives from the Lane County Health & Human Services Department, District Attorney's Office, Sheriff's Office, Circuit Court and LCOG.
