C. BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS:

On August 26, 2003 the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services announced that Lane County, under the auspices of the Human Services Commission (HSC), had been awarded grant funding and designated as a federally qualified health center. In order to implement the federal Community Health Centers of Lane County (CHCLC) grant, a 15 member Advisory Council must be formed that includes consumers, health care and community representatives.

A majority of members of the Council (eight) must be people who are served by the CHCLC, consumer members, and who as a group represents the individuals being served. The two Springfield consumers who applied are being recommended for appointment. Six more consumer representatives will be seated prior to April 1, 2004 with the implementation of clinical services.

The remaining seven members recommended for appointment are comprised of members with a broad range of skills and expertise. No more than half of the non-consumer representatives may derive their annual income from the health care industry. The three health care appointees include representatives of three major community health partners, Peace Health, McKenzie Willamette and LIPA. The four non-health care community member positions include the superintendent of Springfield School District 19, executive directors of the regional Latino and HIV social service organizations, and a retired health educator.

The Lane Manual allows for three-year terms, ending June 30. In establishing this new advisory council, staff has randomly assigned staggered terms to allow for continuity and renewal over time.

Loren C. Barlow, M.D. Community Health Centers Advisory Council Application

1. Brief description of experience and training.

I am a recently retired M.D. who practiced Internal Medicine in Eugene for 47 years. I was the Lane County Medical Society President in 1982. I was Chief of the Medical Staff of Sacred Heart Medical Center from 1973-75. I helped form Oregon Medical Group (OMG) and was the first president of the organization for 7 years. During the 1970's I was on the Regional Health Advisory Board which had the authorization to act on Certificate of Need applications for health care facilities. During the 1980's I was on the governing board of an HMO called SelectCare.

Most recently I have been on the governing board of PeaceHealth Oregon Region (PHOR). On June 30, 2004, I will be finishing my 12th year on the Board. While on the Board, I have chaired the Medical Affairs and Quality Committee for the past 8 years. I also have been a member of the Community Health Committee since its formation 7 years ago.

At the present time, I hold the position of Medical Director of Community Health of PHOR. My primary role is to maximize the collaborative relationship of the Community Health Committee and PHOR in community health initiatives. I am also a board member of the Cottage Grove Critical Access Hospital.

2. Why do you want to become a member of this committee and what specific contributions do you hope to make?

I have an interest in improving access to healthcare for the uninsured and underserved population of this area. I would also like to see the committee have a strong focus on continuous quality improvement, as well as eliminating disparities in the patients they serve. I believe my experience in my previous roles would be of value. I have the time and energy to devote to the committee.

3. List the community concerns related to this committee you would like to see addressed if you are appointed.

I would like to see the committee address the issue of healthcare access and lack of a "medical home" that occurs from being uninsured, on Medicaid, or on the OHP. The Federally Qualified Community Health Center will not fill the gap; however, the committee could be the facilitator and convener of an initiative to achieve "100% access and 0% disparity." The disparity of healthcare outcomes based on income, gender, and ethnicity needs to be seriously addressed. This is an initiative that was originally led by the Bureau of Primary Healthcare and is now being led by several organizations in the private sector.

4. Briefly describe your present or past involvement in relevant community groups.

My initial efforts occurred in 1961 when I was Chairperson of the Lane County Medical Society Community Health Committee. I became the Chair of the Salk Polio Vaccine Initiative that immunized the Eugene-Springfield communities against Polio.

My present efforts include my role as Medical Director of Community Health at PHOR, as described above. I also serve as a volunteer at the Volunteers in Medicine Clinic, where I see medical patients in a traditional physician-patient model. In addition, I am involved in a group visit project providing education to and caring for diabetic patients. Group visits are an attempt to expand access by eliminating the one-on-one aspect of patient care by adopting previously proven innovative models.


