I. MOTION

IT IS MOVED THAT EMPIRE PACIFIC WINDOWS BE AWARDED A CONTRACT TO MANUFACTURE AND DELIVER INSULATED VINYL REPLACEMENT WINDOWS FOR THE WEATHERIZATION OF HOMES PROJECT 04-W-0039; THAT AN ORDER BE SIGNED TO THIS EFFECT; AND THAT AN AGREEMENT BE EXECUTED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE BID DOCUMENTS.

II. ISSUE

Award of a contract to the lowest responsible and responsive bidder to manufacture and deliver insulated vinyl replacement windows for the Agency's Low-Income Weatherization Program.

III. DISCUSSION

A. Background

For more than twenty years, HACSA has purchased storm and replacement windows through the public bidding process. This year we solicited bids for manufacturing and delivery of insulated vinyl replacement windows on an as needed basis. Bids are organized in such a way that separate prices are given for different window types (fixed, horizontal or vertical sliding) on a

united-inch basis. Full unit prices are requested for standard size insulated patio doors. A weighted formula is used to compare and determine the lowest bidder based on the aggregate of the sixteen bid items. These prices are the basis for estimating costs and computing payments for manufactured windows ordered and delivered for individual homes weatherized through our low-income program.

B. Analysis

This bid solicitation was sent to the McGraw Hill Construction Plan Center in Portland and advertised in the Register Guard. Certainteed Corporation from Washington and Empire Pacific Windows (EPI) of Oregon, responded to our bid announcement. Empire Pacific Windows provided the lowest responsible bid which compares favorably (3% lower) with prices we currently pay. We expect this \$350,000 window contract will be the only one needed for the next 12 to 15 months.

Results of the factored window bids were as follows:

1. Empire Pacific Windows: \$643.00

2. Certainteed Corp: \$657.80

C. <u>Alternatives/Options</u>

Empire Pacific Windows submitted the lowest responsible bid. In that budget funds are available, this contract should be awarded to Empire Pacific Windows.

D. Recommendation

It is recommended that Empire Pacific Windows be awarded this contract to manufacture and deliver insulated vinyl replacement windows.

E. Timing

Upon bid award, the contractor shall have ten days to provide the Agency with a performance security bond for \$350,000. It's anticipated that all other necessary documents can be processed by the end of June and that window deliveries will begin shortly thereafter.
