MOTION

THAT THE BOARD ORDER BE ADOPTED AWARDING REQUIREMENTS CONTRACTS FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES IN BRIDGE ENGINEERING CONSULTATION TO OTAK, INC. IN THE NTE AMOUNT OF \$325,000 AND CH2M HILL IN THE NTE AMOUNT OF \$175,000 TO BE EXECUTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUEST FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AND THAT THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR IS AUTHORIZED TO EXECUTE THE CONTRACT AGREEMENTS.

II. ISSUE AND PROBLEM

Lane County Department of Public Works has need of flexible on-call bridge engineering services for various projects. The types of projects include but are not limited to bridge structures, retaining walls, drainage/culverts, manholes/vaults, embankment and slope stabilization and emergency repair designs. The projects will range in scope from new construction to minor repair or maintenance. These consultant services will aid the County's ability to support project development, construction management, bridge preservation and operations and roadway safety.

III. DISCUSSION

A. Background.

In April 2004, fifteen (15) bridge engineering consulting firms were mailed Request for Professional Services notifications. Five firms responded to the request. Based on a combination of performance records and other required qualifications, the selection committee judged the selected firms as qualified to perform the work described in the Request for Professional Services.

B. Analysis.

The County realistically expects that the bridge projects listed in the current CIP as well as increasing bridge, road and culvert maintenance activities will require some outside bridge engineering services. Language in the Request for Professional Services allows the option of renewing the agreements for two additional one-year time periods. This allows for uninterrupted bridge consulting services.

C. <u>Alternatives/Options</u>

- 1. Contract with selected firms (staff recommendation).
- 2. Solicit professional services and award contracts on a project-by-project basis.
- 3. Hire additional staff.

D. Recommendation.

Staff recommends that the Board award contracts to the selected consultants for work assigned during the first year of the contract.

Per language in the Request for Professional Services, the contracts may be amended to extend time and/or dollar limits during the current and the two subsequent one-year terms as specified in the contracts.

IV. IMPLEMENTATION/FOLLOW-UP

Upon approval by the Board, the contracts will be processed for execution by the County Administrator.
