In addition, one (1) member's first term was completed and this member applied and is being recommended for reappointment.

The LCHRAC received 15 (fifteen) applications for membership when it advertised for these four (4) vacancies in April, 2004. A panel of three (3) committee members interviewed eight (8) of the applicants. Five (5) applicants were selected for the Committee from among those interviewed.



1. Give a brief description of the experience or training that qualifies you for membership on this advisory committee.

I plan to approach my term with a full spectrum viewpoint to address the issues facing the Commission. My work and educational experiences have allowed me the unique opportunity to have lived in a diversity of populations and cultures. Growing up in a metropolitan environment (Los Angeles during the Civil Rights movement), I then made the adjustment to the university town environment of Eugene when I began my studies at the University of Oregon. Throughout my life, whether it be business or of a personal nature, I have always interacted well with a variety of groups, socioeconomic backgrounds and lifestyles, as well as a variety of ethnic and religious cultures. I have resided and worked in parts of the United States that included a diversity of population areas. Through these experiences I have learned (and continue to learn) a great deal about the effect of the local political thinking (especially in small towns) as opposed to those who reside in a city. I have experienced what it is like to have a respectable position and money. And I know the reality of how one is treated when they are financially dependent on the local social services. My work in VISTA (in Eugene) gave me experience in dealing with people who suffered with severe mental health issues in a society that would just as soon they went away. I have attached a resume that details a history of my work-related responsibilities and educational background.

For 7½ years I resided and worked in Costa Rica and Panama, (as well as 2 years in Miami, Florida), where I leaned the language as well as the cultures of these tow Central American countries. In Miami, I was immersed in the Cuban culture. As a Caucasian American male, I experienced first hand being a "minority." The years I spent in Central America gave me the opportunity to experience and know what "diversity" means in its purest form. I chose to become immersed in a foreign culture and continue to do so whenever the opportunity presents itself. My experiences over the last 15 years has shown me what legal compliance means through my studies and experience as a Paralegal. I know what is like to work for local government and see how easily some coworkers forgot that the community they served were in fact their bosses. And I know what it is like to have juggle to make ends meet, depending on government workers who have both made the system work and those who make you have to work the system to get little more than grief and judgmental treatment. The eclectic and diverse nature of my educational, work and living experiences makes me uniquely qualified to be an effective member of the Human Rights Advisory Committee.

From the viewpoint as both a former public employee who served the public and now a person receiving services from public employees, I am concerned that the application of the concepts of diversity, human and civil rights and the importance of respecting an individuals dignity is all too often seen by those in positions of authority as one more group of policies drawing their authority from the procedures that define how and when these procedures are to be carried and/or enforced. 

- 1. I retired April 1, 2004 after working nearly 35 years in various public and private non-profit organizations in Oregon. During that time I had the opportunity to work with many communities with human/civil rights issues: African-Americans, Gypsies, refugees from Asia and Eastern Europe, Latino farmworkers, woman seeking construction jobs, domestic violence victims. I have a long standing appreciation for the learning that comes from exposure to different cultures/perspectives/experiences, and have developed a passion for helping to translate the experience of others to those for whom personal or system constraints make it difficult to practice tolerance, let alone appreciation, of diversity.
- 2. I would like to continue to use my skills and experience to make a contribution to this community. Human rights is an area which interests me greatly. In addition to the exposure to a wide variety of cultural perspectives mentioned in question #1, I have in the course of my work become familiar with many local entities eight law enforcement jurisdictions, Dept. of Human Resources, Looking Glass, Oregon Employment Division, D.A.'s office, etc.. I have worked on a myriad of program and advocacy issues with caseworkers, public health, legal and law enforcement staff. I understand the constraints under which they work and what affects their perceptions of their clients. I have also worked as a victim advocate for the past six years, and know how to solve problems and help people access community resources. I also understand how difficult it is to access resources without a complex understanding of how things work.
- 3. I do not have a strong agenda regarding what specific concerns should be handled by this committee, or the priority they deserve. My sense is that many aspects of this community suffer from limited perspectives and

dwindling resources, which often result in friction and quick judgements about who to blame and/or exclude. In general I would like to encourage a wide open multi-cultural consideration of concerns that come to the committee, and an increased ability to offer education, outreach, and inclusion to marginalized members of the community, be it by race, culture, class, economic status or victimization.

- 4. I have lived in Lane County for almost 15 years. I have been an active volunteer in the 4j school district as my child went through elementary, middle and high school here (she graduates in June). Otherwise my involvement in community groups has been related to child abuse and domestic violence through my work as a victim advocate at the Child Advocacy Center.
- 5. I value diversity above all other qualities in a community, except ethics and the quality of water and air! I believe that the best solution usually turns an "either/or" question into an "and" answer. I actually think it is very satisfying to find solutions that honor all contenders. I challenge myself to use creative thinking when considering issues, and encourage empathy in others. I believe that a healthy community should be open to new ideas and cultural offerings, and try hard to balance the diverse needs of its members. I am not a saint I don't appreciate it when my neighbor's dog poops on my lawn or hacks branches off my tree without permission. But I do find that reason, kindness and communication often ease what can otherwise be volatile situations. I also have an understanding of systems issues, and how to apply logistical fixes to what look like human problems.
