# II. ISSUE OR PROBLEM

In the State of Oregon, Head Start is now in its 38<sup>th</sup> year of successfully meeting the needs of low-income children and their families. Theodore R. Kulongoski, Governor of the State of Oregon has proclaimed the first week of October as Head Start Awareness Week in Oregon and by doing so has called attention to the accomplishments of the Head Start Program and urges all citizens to increase their awareness of the services provided. We want to build on this statewide recognition by drawing specific attention to the incredible achievements of our local Head Start programs by requesting the Board proclaim a Head Start Awareness Week in Lane County.

## III. <u>DISCUSSION</u>

# A. Background/Analysis

Since its inception in May 1965, the Head Start program has provided health, educational, and social services to more than 20 million children and their families in every US state and territory. In doing so, it has established itself as the foremost Early Childhood Development program in the United States. Head Start provides not only for the educational and exceptional needs of children, but also for their social, psychological,

heath, and nutritional requirements.

Head Start has been encouraging Lane County families in their role as parents since 1968. Head Start collaborates with school districts, social service agencies and the medical community to support parents support their childrens healthy growth, development and education. Head Start is integrated into all parts of Lane County. Locally, it provides comprehensive services to over 800 low-income families annually.

In 1987, Oregon established the state-funded Head Start Pre-Kindergarten, modeled after the successful federal Head Start program.

## B. Alternatives/Options

- 1. To declare the first week of October 2004 as HEAD START AWARENESS WEEK IN LANE COUNTY.
- Not to declare the first week of October 2004 as HEAD START WARENESS WEEK IN LANE COUNTY.

#### C. Recommendation

Option 1: adopt the order to declare the first week of October 2004 as HEAD START AWARENESS WEEK IN LANE COUNTY.
