ORDER _____ To proclaim the week of April 4-10, 2005 as National Public Health Week

II. ISSUE OR PROBLEM

Organizations throughout Oregon and the United States recognize the week of April 4-10, 2005 as National Public Health Week and as an opportunity to promote health and acknowledge the benefits of public health.

III. DISCUSSION

A. Background / Analysis

Lane County Public Health, as part of the statewide system of public health organizations, is committed to promoting activities that protect citizens from communicable diseases, environmental and workplace hazards, chronic disease, unintentional injuries, and violence. National Public Health Week is an opportunity to promote health and acknowledge the benefits of public health to our residents. Public Health programs emphasize prevention, a more cost effective approach to health than restoration or cure. The national 2005 theme is "Live Stronger, Longer!"

From a national perspective, public health has made great achievements in improving the health status of people over the past 100 years. Since 1900, the average lifespan of people living in the United States has lengthened by more than 30 years; 25 years of this gain are due to advances in public health. The Centers for Disease Control has identified the following ten great public health achievements that have contributed to the longer lifespan: vaccinations, motor-

vehicle safety, safer workplaces, control of infectious diseases, decline in the number of deaths from coronary heart disease and stroke, safer and healthier foods, healthier mothers and babies, family planning, fluoridation of drinking water, and recognition of tobacco use as a health hazard. Highlighting these ten achievements illustrates the successful response public health has made in addressing the major causes of morbidity and mortality of the 20th century. These achievements also illustrate the ability of public health to respond to a vast array of diverse challenges in order to increase the health of the community.
