I. MOTION

Move approval of the Order appointing Ken Tollenaar to serve as a lay member for a three-year term on the Law Library Advisory Committee.

II. ISSUE OR PROBLEM

There is one lay member vacancy on the Law Library Advisory Committee due to the expiration of Heather Cranor's term (appointed April 3, 2002, expired April 3, 2005.)

III. DISCUSSION

A. Background

The Law Library Advisory Committee has two lay member positions, which each serve three-year terms. The Board on 4/3/02 appointed Ms. Cranor, and Ms. Melissa Mona was appointed on 2/26/03, due to a resignation of another appointee. In addition, there are seven (7) other voting members of the Committee, appointed to one-year terms by the President of the Lane County Bar Association. There is one ex-officio position, which is shared by law librarians from the University of Oregon's Law Library. A current roster of members is attached.

B. Analysis

The Lay member vacancy was advertised from February 25, 2005 through March 25, 2005 and two applications were received. (Mr. Kenneth Tollenaar and Ms. Nadia Sindi - Copies of these applications are attached.) The Committee met on April 19th, 2005 to review applications received, and set up a Special Meeting on April 27th, to interview each applicant further. The Committee again met on May 31st (the May 17th meeting was rescheduled due to lack of an available quorum on that date) to review the results of the interviews and discuss each candidate.

Committee members felt that both candidates had many strong positive qualities to contribute to the Committee's structure, but after discussion, chose to recommend Mr. Ken Tollenaar. This recommendation is based on Mr. Tollenaar's past use and understanding of the current Law Library facility, as well as his prior work with non-profit and administrative agencies.

C. Alternatives/Options

- 1. Accept the recommendation of the Law Library Advisory Committee to appoint Ken Tollenaar to the vacant Lay Member position on the Committee.
- 2. Appoint the other applicant (Ms. Nadia Sindi) to the vacant position.
- 3. Reject all applicants and direct staff to re-advertise the position.
