D. **BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS:** The Lane County Human Rights Advisory Committee (LCHRAC) had ten (10) vacancies that were left by nine (9) members who resigned their positions, and one member whose term expired. Because of the large number of new members being appointed, staff recommends that in order to stagger the terms, the first five (5) in alphabetical order be initially appointed for three (3) years and the remaining five (5) be appointed for four (4) years.

The LCHRAC received fifteen (15) applications for membership when it advertised for these ten (10) vacancies from June through August, 2005. A panel of three (3), comprised of committee member Aaron Boyce, BCC liaison to the committee Commissioner Green, and former staff liaison Laura Yergan, interviewed eleven (11) of the applicants. One applicant withdrew after interviewing, and the remaining four failed to respond to invitations to interview. Ten (10) applicants were selected for the Committee from among those interviewed.

1. For most of my adult life, I have been motivated professionally and personally by issues of diversity, community, and human rights, and have sought constructive ways to foster these locally. I have worked in the mental health and chemical dependency field, with training from Willamette School of Human Service, housed at White Bird Clinic. I have also worked with diverse communities such as low income/homeless populations, sexual minorities, and people living with HIV/AIDS. I have participated in projects designed to appropriately serve the Latino community. My resume details my work and training further.

I have training and experience in group facilitation, advocacy, public speaking, and successful grant writing.

- 2. I have for some time considered membership in either this committee or the Eugene Human Rights Commission. I look forward to the opportunity to advocate for human rights issues on a local level, and to find constructive, incremental ways to make Lane County a positive place for diverse people to live. I also like the idea of participating in this committee in particular because it is county-wide, and rural issues are included in its scope.
- 3. I imagine issues of ethnic diversity and socioeconomic diversity to be important on this committee. I would first like to see how the committee works and sets its agenda, and have read some of the meeting minutes. After getting a flavor for the work the committee is already doing, I would like to add my own perspective in a way that fits. Some of my specific interests are in how the county structure handles complaints from marginalized community members, and how the county structure can be improved to be accessible to those who do not traditionally have good access, such as the homeless, people whose primary language is not English, and people with high risk behaviors.
- 4. I have been involved in local groups such as the Heroin Task Force (1999-2001), HIV Alliance's Needle Exchange Advisory Board, the Community meeting at White Bird Clinic, and have attended neighborhood groups in the past. I teach inservices on high risk populations to local organizations such as Eugene Fire and EMS, and Eugene Municipal Court.
- 5. My ethic is that a strong community has room for diverse cultures, and that our county structure should and can reflect this. I love the opportunity to advocate for creative ways to meet diverse needs and have proven experience doing this in a constructive way.
- 6. I am currently a member of HIV Alliance's Needle Exchange Advisory Board.

# Robert L. Weiss: Items 1-5 Application for Citizen Advisory Committee (page 1 of 2)

- 1. I am a retired Professor of Psychology from the University of Oregon, where I served on the Clinical Psychology Faculty for over 35 years. I have considerable experience dealing with persons involved in interpersonal conflict and with the adjudication of ethical concerns. My career has spanned the areas of communication training, problem solving, and inter group facilitation. As an educator I am especially concerned with the dissemination of information that enables individuals to function more effectively, both in terms of psychological (client) populations, students, and in my contact with community members.
- 2. Being retired, my schedule makes it possible for me to volunteer my services more broadly than before. I am most interested in contributing to efforts that reflect my areas of expertise. The Human Rights Advisory Committee would be an excellent fit for me since the majority of concerns that come before that committee involve various stages of citizens having conflict with a governmental body. Being able to assess the nature of the conflict and working together with other members to recommend solutions is something that I am well qualified to do. I see myself playing a role in team building and fostering an understanding of how individuals become locked into win-lose conflicts. Over the years I have served as a site visitor for the credentialing body of the American Psychological Association, where either as a member or chair of a visiting team we assessed a training program's success in meeting national standards. This work requires ability to quickly assess the strengths and weaknesses of university and internship training departments and to communicate a fair, objective appraisal of the organization. Once again, I see these skills of potential benefit to my serving on the Advisory Committee.
- 3. In my view an Advisory Committee does not make policy but rather serves as the eyes and ears for County Commissioners by offering assessments and recommendations developed by the Advisory group. My sense is that the single most pressing issue facing a Human Rights Advisory Committee today is the widespread sense of disenfranchisement so many of our citizens experience, especially those of limited means. Most often folks do not feel heard by their government, that they have no significant voice. Issues of discrimination, apparent arbitrary governmental impositions of new regulations, or failure of government to address concerns of daily life, all contribute to felt disenfranchisement. Cyclical fluctuations in economic prosperity further contribute to people's sense of being marginalized. How individual concerns get expressed often adds to the problem and the attempted solutions become the bigger problem.

- 4. My community involvement has been as a past board member of the local ACLU chapter and during the past 5 plus years as a board member of Planned Parenthood Health Services of Southwest Oregon (PPHSSO).
- 5. I am quite familiar with efforts to increase diversity and foster programs that actively encourage participation of persons whose involvement might otherwise be overlooked. For example, as Chair of the Leadership Committee of PPHSSO, I direct efforts to recruit minority group members as potential board members; gender, age, ethnicity, disability, among other manifestations of diversity, are always central to the efforts of management, clinical services and the Board committee. As a Professor of Psychology I have had experience working with students from highly diverse backgrounds and have participated in various selection processes designed to increase the presence of members of so called minority groups. Specifically, I would foster activities of the Advisory Group to ensure accountability of County Employment recruitment efforts. With my membership in national professional organizations diversity issues are ever in the forefront and are specifically listed in the American Psychological Association's Code of Ethics.

## 2. Why do you want to become a member of this committee, and what specific contributions do you hope to make?

I have served as a community advocate and educator to promote an inclusive society over the last ten years in both academics and professionally. With a Bachelor's in International Studies from the School for International Training, I have an academic focus in identifying and dismantling oppressive systems utilizing grassroots organizing, interagency cooperation and cross-cultural strategies.

I coordinated community development projects in Guatemala and Mexico including intensive work in refugee camps and repatriated communities for several years. When I returned to Oregon I continued to work with diverse communities for social justice. This work includes ten years in social services and education in the following capacities: International Program Coordinator and Advisor for disability and minority rights; Bilingual Employment Specialist and Service Provider; Farmworker Advocate; Adult Basic Education Instructor and Advisor; and Bilingual/ELL Educator.

In addition, I completed my MA in Community and Regional Planning from the University of Oregon. My studies focused on promoting inclusive policies and community development for Oregon's Latino populations. My thesis is titled, The Power of Culture, Place and Agency: Understanding Agrarian Conflicts in Oregon's Willamette Valley.

I have continued to work extensively in Oregon's diverse communities to promote an inclusive and just society. Being bilingual (English-Spanish) has opened many doors in social services and education. Most recently, I was an English Language Learner (ELL) teacher for Roseburg Public Schools. This particular community has few assets supporting people of diverse backgrounds and I was part of the beginning force to bring about change and awareness against a great deal of resistance. I had to remain strong in my convictions and build a base of allies via grassroots initiatives. My efforts included; organizing the Multicultural Literacy Night programs; co-sponsoring speaker events and round table discussions on worldviews; actively participating in the Hispanic Committee; training educators on diversity, laws and racism; and co-leading presentations and workshops for Roseburg's Cultural Competency Committee.

With my extensive background in social justice and my innate understanding of theoretical frameworks that guide our society's behaviors. I wish to share these skills to further our work for a more just and safe community.
