COMMITTEE CHARGE:

To advise the Board of County Commissioners and the Department of Health & Human Services on matters relating to mental health in Lane County by reviewing major policies of the mental health program, and making recommendations to the director. Assists in identifying needs and priorities and reviews Lane County's annual Mental Health Plan and budget.

C. BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS

Due to the resignations of David Piercy, Russell Evans, the term expiration of Nancy Terry, and the untimely death of Tevina Benedict, four MHAC/LADPC vacancies were advertised from March 14, 2005 to March 22, 2005. Due to insufficient applications, it was re-posted from April 28, 2005 to June 3, 2005. That advertisement indicated that minority groups were encouraged to apply. This was done to recruit minority members and fulfill Oregon statutory requirement to the Local Alcohol & Drug Planning Committee (ORS 430.342).

At the close of the second advertisement period, eight applications were on file in the office of county administration. The MHAC/LADPC reviewed the eight applications and conducted interviews. After the interviews, the recommendations of Jennifer Wells, Charles Wright, Cheryl Rade, and Tim Mueller were made to fill the vacancies.

In addition, the committee is requesting that one of its current members, Debra Depew, be allowed to remain on the committee through her second term, which expires May 31, 2007. She was recently employed with a mental health agency which is a subcontractor of Lane County. Lane Manual 3.506 has conflict of interest language that excludes employees of vendors/subcontractors from serving on county advisory committees if they "actively participate in the management of the organization." Deb is a family support specialist and is not part of the management of the subcontractor organization.

A problem arises because the specific language in Lane Manual 3.524 has a tighter standard than LM 3.506. It states that "subcontractors of mental health services, their employees and their board members are barred from membership on this committee." Deb has been a very active member of the committee, the child and adolescent subcommittee, and various committees of LaneCare. She has also represented us at state committees/meetings. She is widely known as a family voice for child and adolescent issues. It would be a great loss for the committee if Deb is not allowed this waiver.

Lane Manual sections 3.520 through 3.554 list committee membership for a wide variety of committees. These sections of the manual appear to have little consistency in the 'no employee' rule. We are requesting a waiver to the "no employee" language in Lane Manual 3.524 and that we be allowed to apply the broader "management employee" language from Lane Manual 3.506 (2) (d).

Charles R.B. Wright

1. Experience and qualifications:

For the past five or six years I have served as a NAMI representative on the LaneCare Quality Assurance Committee and on its Delivery Systems and Credentialing, Contracting, Consumer Relations subcommittees. Before that, I was a member of the LaneCare ad hoc committee to develop a county public guardianship program. My wife's son suffers from schizophrenia, and she and I have been active members of NAMI for many years. I am on the local NAMI legislative committee and have spent a little time in Salem testifying and meeting with legislators.

I am retired from the mathematics faculty at the University of Oregon. During my UO career, I served on, and often chaired, most of the major standing faculty committees, as well as a number of ad hoc committees at the university and state system levels. In addition, I served hitches as department head and associate dean.

2. Hoped-for contributions:

Primarily, I hope to bring to the committee the perspective of a concerned family member of a mentally ill adult, and in that way to represent the interests of most NAMI members. I would like to believe that my extensive committee experience and my analytical skills can be useful in committee deliberations and in seeking solutions to complex problems. I also hope to bring knowledge of the County committee's concerns back to NAMI and to the LaneCare setting.

3. Community concerns to address:

I still live in hope of setting up a public guardianship program. Another, perhaps intractable, issue is better coordination of mental health and substance abuse programs, so as to treat dual diagnosis clients more effectively. More generally, I am simply interested in doing what I can to improve mental health services for all people in our county.

I. MOTION

That the Board of Commissioners move to adopt by resolution the revised Emergency Operations Plan for Lane County and the National Incident Management System.

II. DISCUSSION

A. Background

On December 11, 2001 the Lane County Board of Commissioners adopted Board Order 01-12-11-2 adopting a revised Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) for Lane County. The 2001 update to the plan was in response to the events of September 11.

Since the 2001 update, Lane County Emergency Management hired a contractor with grant funds to review Lane County's (EOP) and make recommendations. The contractor and Emergency Management developed a revised draft of the plan to reflect current operations using plain language. The revised draft was sent out for review and comment to all Lane County Department Heads. Feedback from the departments has been incorporated into the revised draft of the EOP.

Additionally, the revised draft of the EOP includes language that is in compliance with Homeland Security Presidential Directive #5 indicating that Lane County adopts the National Incident Management Systems (NIMS) for responding to emergencies and disasters.

In the process of updating the EOP it was determined that it should be consistent with Lane Manual Chapter 54. Revisions to Lane Manual Chapter 54 have been submitted for production and will be ready for Board adoption in approximately 3 weeks.
