#### **COMMITTEE CHARGE:**

To advise the Board of County Commissioners and Human Services Commission (HSC) on services that alleviate the conditions of poverty and promote and improve the health, well-being, self-sufficiency, and safety of low income, disadvantaged, and disabled Lane County residents. The committee reviews the annual budgets, plans, and evaluations of the operation of human services sponsored by the HSC to insure program effectiveness.

#### D. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

The Lane County Board of County Commissioners has served as the governing board for Lane County's Community Action Program since 1972. The Community Action Program is the delivery system for state and federal anti-poverty programs. Since 1983 the operation of this mandated advisory committee, for anti-poverty funding in Lane County, has functioned to assist the HSC as a part of its budget and planning process. This coupling of functions has allowed for the efficient integration of decision-making in the allocation of funding to local non-profit groups.

This committee has designated slots for recruitment within the mandated tripartite advisory board structure, consisting of equal parts local private sector, public sector, and low income representatives. The HSC designated slots for recruitment for specific community interests include: clergy, criminal justice programs, health care organizations, consumers, public welfare programs, and advocacy organizations. This structure brings together community leaders from each of these groups to collaborate on developing responses to local needs.

The Lane Manual 3.530 allows for two four-year terms, ending June 30. However, in practice the HSC public officials (elected/appointed) are appointed annually and have served one-year terms beginning on January 1. In the past the HSC has recommended appointing members for up to two-year staggered terms. It will also consider the "elected/appointed official category". The HSC requests the Board waive the term requirements for this appointment on the condition that the HSC prepare a recommended rule change for future presentations to the Board. This request is made to avoid protracted delays in Ms. Ortiz's valued membership.

The Human Services Commission approved the recommendation of this appointment at their July 20, 2006 meeting.


