COMMITTEE CHARGE:

To advise the Board of County Commissioners and the Department of Health & Human Services on matters relating to mental health, addiction disorders, and developmental disabilities in Lane County by reviewing major policies of these health and human services programs, and making recommendations to the director and the Board of County Commissioners. The committee also assists in identifying needs, priorities and reviews the county's biennial Mental Health & Addictions Implementation Plan.

The committee's recommendations for appointment are based on individual expertise and knowledge in the various categories necessary to complete requirements of the committee. Also, appointment recommendations are made with an eye toward meeting the needs of representation not already present on the committee.

It is important to have a diverse and well-informed committee. Expertise and knowledge in mental health, both child and adult, addiction, developmental disabilities, prevention and treatment is necessary to ensure adequate representation for the comprehensive focus of this committee.

The geographical diversity of the applicants is considered to ensure all commissioner districts are represented.

C. BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS

Due to the term expirations of Debra Depew and the resignation of Cheryl Rade, MHAC/LADPC vacancies were advertised from March 14, 2007 to April 13, 2007 and from May 11, 2007 to June 15, 2007.

At the close of the advertisement period, five completed applications were on file in the office of county administration. An interview panel comprised of current MHAC/LADPC members reviewed the five applications and conducted interviews. Four applicants were interviewed on July 24, 2007. Prior to the interview, the fifth applicant requested that her name be withdrawn from consideration. After the interviews, another candidate requested that his name be withdrawn citing "family changes".

Therefore, of the three remaining applicants the following recommendations have been made:

Lane County Advisory Committee Application – Larry D. Sullivan, Ph.D. Mental Health Advisory Committee

1) Resume and Background Information

- 2) The mental health needs of children and families in the state of Oregon are not being met. An increasing number of families, including a disproportionate number of children with severe mental health needs and disabilities, have significant social and emotional barriers to learning and development. Our school districts and mental health agencies struggle to integrate and coordinate services to effectively provide both prevention and intervention mental health services for children and families. Diminished funding makes it very difficult for our community and agencies to create safe and supportive home environments, and provide comprehensive services for families. As a member of the Mental Health Advisory Committee, I would bring a school district's special education perspective and an extensive background in as a mental health and school psychologist practitioner.
- 3) Our community must address the issue of more adequately serving the emerging mental health needs of younger children, adolescents and families, and specific underserved groups, i.e., individuals on the autism spectrum. In addition, the continued substance abuse crisis and the effects of poverty and family discord, require agencies and school to re-think the restructure mental health services and family supports.

4) Background Information

- 5) I recently completed attended a course entitled "Discrimination and the Oregon Educator." Although I have worked in large urban school districts, lived in vary diverse communities, and advocated for children with disabilities and their families, I was surprised, after reflection and activities in the course, that I have less of an understanding and need some work to really be more culturally competent. If selected, I would contribute my knowledge, advocacy, and continued reflection and personal growth to help ensure that our efforts to address discrimination and diversity are foreground in the committee's work.
- 6) I am currently serving on the Oregon Department of Education's Special Education Advisory Committee, Urban Schools Special Education Directors Group, and the Oregon School Psychologist Association Executive Committee.

Background Information: Larry D. Sullivan, Ph.D.

I am the Director of Educational Support Services in the Eugene School District 4J. The District has 18,000 students with approximately 2,500 students with disabilities. The Educational Support Services Department has 290 FTE employees and an annual budget of \$28.0 million. The Eugene School District is widely known for innovative programming, especially in the area of Autism Spectrum Disorders, and services to meet the instructional needs of a diverse and growing student population. I have had extensive experience in special education litigation, including due process and complaint cases, and I have worked to collaborate with community partners — University of Oregon, mental health services, and disability stakeholder groups, for example, Lane County Autism Society. I am actively involved in District leadership activities, including the Instructional Leadership Team, Strategic Planning Committee, and the District's collective bargaining team. I continue to participate as a member of the Oregon Department of Education's Special Education Advisory Committee, Urban School SPED Directors Group, and the Oregon School Psychologist Association Executive Committee.

I was previously the assistant superintendent for curriculum, instruction and pupil services in the Plain Local Schools in Canton, Ohio. The 430 teachers and staff provide a highly recognized academic program for 6,400. In my three years as assistant superintendent, I continued to build on the successful instructional and program reforms in the district, as well as, developing and implementing an effective model for instruction and learning and parent/community engagement for our lowest achieving schools. I took a leadership role in making significant changes to the district's assessments and grading procedures. I also coordinated a district-wide effect to restructure our pupil services and special education programs.

I held the position of Director of the Safe Schools/Healthy Students Action Center. The Action Center was funded (3 year/9 million) by the U.S. Departments of Health and Human Services, Education and Justice, and operated by the National Mental Health Association and the National Association of School Psychologists. The goal of the Action Center was to provide consultation-based technical assistance to the Safe Schools/Healthy Students and School Action grantees as part of the Federal School Violence Initiative. These TA services helped over 100 sites across the country to develop, implement and sustain evidence-based programs and comprehensive services for children, youth, families and communities.

I was previously the Assistant Executive Director for the National Association of School Psychologists. This position was responsible for program development and oversight of the following programs: government and professional relations including public policy, public information, professional standards, and communications. I took a leadership role in NASP's efforts to advocate for and reauthorize legislation that supported children with

disabilities, preK-16 education, and mental health services. I also represented NASP's legislative and professional practice agenda through participation in various national consortiums and committees.

Prior to relocating in the Washington, D.C. area, I was the project director for both the Columbus Public Schools and Baltimore City Public Schools Urban Systemic Initiatives. These grants were funded by the National Science Foundation (5 year/15 million) with the goal of making changes to mathematics and science instruction and the utilization of technology in large urban districts.

In the area of school psychology, in addition to being a practitioner for over twelve years, I was a member of the graduate faculty at the University of Dayton, teaching courses in School Psychology and Counselor Education Programs, and I was the supervisor of Psychological Services for the Columbus Public Schools. The supervisor position responsibilities included the administration of comprehensive school-based psychological and mental health services. My research interests are in the areas of professional development in teaching and learning, performance assessments, and program evaluation.

 I am a retired health policy professor with an MSW, MPA and PhD with a background in psychiatric social work, Agency administration, and direct service to mental health and alcohol and drug clients over the past 50 years, including work with spanish peaking clients for LULAC, the League of Latin American Citizens.
- 2. Why do you want to become a member of this committee, and what specific contributions do you hope to make? I care about people who struggle with mental health problems both professionally and personally as I have close family members that I love, who live with mental health problems. Additionally, I have a long professional and personal experience with the history and present systems of mental health care for our populations.
- 3. List the community concerns related to this committee that you would like to see addressed if you are appointed. As a policy person as well as a family member I would like to see an improved and comprehensive system of prevention activities, acute safe crisis care, appropriate residential care, outpatient care and support and improved development of client involvement in their own care. Further research and work on the use of psychotropic drugs, which can be of great benefit, but also pose risks, is a goal I support. In Lane County, I feel that our ability to deal with our population who have mental health problems has been degraded by putting it into individual insurance plans, underfunded in many cases. Our former county mental health system was better able to meet the needs. The need for hospitalization for safety (rather than the jail, where the acutely psychotic are often hospitalized) has gone away. We need to restore our psychiatric center and greatly improve follow-up and aftercare for both alcohol and drug and psychiatric clients.
