The membership has consisted of 2 Board members, the County Administrator, and the Director of the Department of Management Services. This Committee has examined real property acquisition and sales, construction and remodel activities, and the Capital Improvement Program for County facilities.
- B. <u>Policy Issues</u> This proposal conforms the Lane Manual with the past practice of the Board regarding the Facilities Committee.
- C. <u>Board Goals</u> Approving the Order relates to the County's Strategic Plan goals "Protect the public's assets by maintaining, replacing, or upgrading the County's investments in systems and capital infrastructures."
- **D.** <u>Financial and/or Resource Considerations</u> There are no anticipated financial implications from placing this Committee within Lane Manual 3.515.
- E. <u>Analysis</u> This Order reflects a practice that the Board has found useful. Describing this Committee in Lane Manual as a Standing Committee will make it easier for citizens and staff to understand how the County addresses facilities issues.
