I. MOTION

Move To Appoint Cilia Maximin and Anselmo Villanueva To The Lane County Commission for the Advancement of Human Rights To Serve For The Remainder Of Two Four - Year Terms Through December 31, 2010.

II. ISSUE OR PROBLEM

There is a need to appoint two members to serve on the Lane County Planning Commission (LCPC) due to a vacancy created by the resignation of Ed Becker.

III. DISCUSSION

A. Background

Lane Code and Lane Manual provide that the Lane County Commission for the Advancement of Human Rights shall be established and that the Commission shall consist of eleven voting members, each of whom shall be a resident of Lane County.

The Board has decided that each Board member will appoint a member of the Commission for the Advancement of Human Rights from their district and the six remaining positions serve at-large. Currently there are two at-large vacant position due to resignations.

B. Analysis

County Administration advertised the vacancies in July and August 2008 through the Advisory Committee application process adopted by the Board. Vacancies are advertised for thirty days, and for unsuccessful appointment candidates, applications are retained in County Administration for one year upon receipt to be considered for future vacancies. Four applications were received during this open recruitment, and these four were considered, along with seven applications on file in County Administration, for the vacancy created by the resignation of Charles Bell and Tina Schiff.

The Commission for the Advancement of Human Rights reviewed all applications for the position on August 28, 2008 and discussed in the public meeting September 17, 2008. Deliberations led to a vote to recommend the

Board of Commissioners appoint Cilia Maximin, Lane Community College Academic Advisor, and Anselmo Villanueva Director of CALC (Community Alliance of Lane County) to the vacant positions.

C. Alternatives/Options

- 1. Accept the recommendation to appoint Cilia Maximin and Anselmo Villanueva as at-large members for their first terms on the LCCHAR.
- 2. Appoint another applicant for this position.
- 3. Re-advertise and reopen the search for applicants to fill the vacancy.
- 4. Do not appoint anyone to fill the vacancy on the Lane County Commission for the Advancement of Human Rights.

D. Recommendation

Staff recommends Alternative 1. LCCAHR also recommends Alternative 1.

E. Timing

Staff will follow-up on the Board's recommendation, immediately. Appointment and thank you letters are not included with this packet. The letters will be sent notifying all candidates following the Board's decision. Applications of the unsuccessful candidates will be kept on file in County Administration for one year, for reconsideration for future vacancies on the CAHR under Lane Manual procedures.

IV. IMPLEMENTATION/FOLLOW-UP

- 1. Send appointment letters to successful candidates.
- 2. Send appreciation letters to unsuccessful candidates.
- 3. Prepare information packets and schedule an orientation session as required.
- 4. Re-open application process if so directed.
