I. MOTION

Move approval of the Order appointing Bill Fisher to serve as a lay member for a three-year term on the Law Library Advisory Committee.

II. ISSUE OR PROBLEM

There is one lay member vacancy on the Law Library Advisory Committee due to the expiration of Mr. Ken Tollenaar's term (appointed April 26, 2005, expired September 30, 2008.) Mr. Tollenaar resigned from his position in August 2007, and after posting this interim vacancy, Mr. Wally Hicks applied for and was appointed to serve out the remainder of Mr. Tollenaar's term. However, Mr. Hicks also had to resign in May 2008, as he became ineligible for the lay position, when he became a member of the Oregon State Bar. The position has remained vacant while additional candidates were recruited and interviewed; the person selected for this position will now be appointed for a completely new term of three years.

III. DISCUSSION

A. Background

The Law Library Advisory Committee has two lay member positions, which each serve three-year terms. The Board on 6/15/05 appointed Mr. Tollenaar, whose term ended September 30, 2008. Mr. Dennis Hyatt, the other lay member appointee, was appointed on April 12, 2006; his term expires on September 30, 2009. In addition, there are a minimum of seven (7) other voting members of the Committee, who are attorneys appointed to one-year terms by the President of the Lane County Bar Association; this number of attorney members can vary according to the number of attorneys who express interest in serving on this Committee, but is always at least seven. There is one ex-officio position, which is shared by law librarians from the University of Oregon's Law Library. A current roster of members is attached.

B. Analysis

The Lay member vacancy was advertised from May to June 2008, and again from July to August. Three applications were received as a result. Copies of these applications were distributed to members of the Advisory Committee and each applicant was invited to different monthly meetings (depending on their availability) so that he/she could talk with members about their backgrounds and interest in the Law Library. Mr. Thomas Dorich was interviewed in June, Ms. Sallie Torres during the September meeting, and Mr. Bill Fisher in October.

After the October 21 meeting, a quorum of Advisory Committee members discussed all of the applicants that they had previously met, and there was general agreement that they were faced with some very good applicants for the one position. However, after some brief debate, the majority voted to recommend Mr. Fisher to the Board for appointment as the second lay representative on the Committee. Most members felt that his background in community education, as well as with libraries, would most benefit the Committee's activities and those of the Law Library.

C. <u>Alternatives/Options</u>

- 1. Accept the recommendation of the Law Library Advisory Committee to appoint Bill Fisher to the vacant Lay Member position on the Committee.
- 2. Reject this applicant in favor of another applicant.
- 3. Reject this applicant and direct staff to re-advertise the position.




