II. **AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY**

The Human Services Commission (HSC) Community Action Advisory Committee (CAAC) seeks to fill three vacancies, affirm five others as county commissioner appointees and correct the term of appointment for other.

III. BACKGROUND/IMPLICATIONS OF ACTION

A. Board Action and Other History

The Community Action Advisory Committee is a mandated committee defined by Oregon Revised Statute 458.505. The statute defines the committee, sets out its responsibilities and stipulates requirements for membership. Membership requirements are:

- One-third of the members are elected public officials currently serving or their designees; and,
- One-third of the members are persons chosen through democratic selection procedures adequate to assure that they are representatives of the poor in the area served; and
- The remainder of the members are officials or members of business, industry, labor, religious, welfare, education or other major groups and interests in the community.

Lane Manual Chapter 3.530 further defines the CAAC and limits membership to 12.

Within those 12 members, four must be public officials currently serving or their designees and must consist of at least one Lane County member, one City of Eugene member and one City of Springfield member. The public official representatives may serve on the committee for a one-year term ending on January 14 and there is no limit to the number of terms that the person in these positions may serve.

The remaining eight members are composed half of "representatives of the poor in the area" and half of "representatives of officials of business, industry, labor, religious, welfare, education or members of major groups and interests in the community." These eight positions are appointed by the Board of Commissioners with terms of four years in length. The CAAC bylaws further limits membership terms for these positions to two – two terms of four years each up to a maximum of eight years.

Then, in April of this year (board order number 09-4-29-1) the board took action regarding appointments to citizen advisory committees and revised Lane Manual 3.506(2)(e). "If an advisory committee consists of more than 5 members, 5 of the committee members shall be appointed by individual commissioners. The remaining committee members shall be at-large members, appointed by the Board of Commissioners... For current appointments, the committees and the Board of Commissioners shall have 6 months from the date of adoption of this section to determine which appointees are at-large appointees and which are appointed by individual commissioners." The six-month period ends on October 29, 2009.

The CAAC has three vacant member positions that are public official or designee positions. In addition, the fourth of the public official/designee positions was filled on April 1, 2009. However, the term of office was incorrectly stated as three years ending on December 31, 2012 rather than one year ending on January 14, 2010. The three vacant positions must be filled and the term of office for the fourth position must be corrected. To that end:

- Mayor Kitty Piercey has designated Martha Roberts as her designee for the City of Eugene;
- Springfield City Councilor Dave Ralston has designated Dan Rupe as his designee for the City of Springfield;
- The Board of Commissioners is being asked to appoint Marty Johnson to serve as a public designee for Lane County; and,
- The Board of Commissioners is being asked to affirm Carmen Urbina to serve as the public official designee for Lane County for the remainder of her oneyear term ending on January 14, 2010.

Finally, the CAAC is seeking to come into compliance with the new rule regarding individual commissioner appointments to advisory committees. There are eight positions that are currently filled in this committee by citizens from the districts that

comprise Lane County. The five commissioners and their appointee affirmations are listed below:

B. Policy Issues

The nominees and appointees meet the qualifications for service on this body per Oregon Statute and the Lane Manual. The Human Services Commission's Manager and Supervisor collaborated with the Community Action Advisory Committee in assessing the qualification of the candidates and working with county commissioners to bring the committee into compliance with the revised Lane Manual requirements.

C. Board Goals

This appointment meets the Board's objective of encouraging citizen participation.

D. Financial and/or Resource Considerations

None

E. Analysis

All proposed appointees have been designated in compliance with ORS458.505, Lane Manual 3.506(2)(e) and Lane Manual 3.530.

Mr. Johnson has served on the CAAC as the Lane County representative since July 26, 2005. He is interested in continuing in this capacity and there is no limit stated to the number of terms that a public official designee may serve. If Mr. Johnson is appointed and serves the one-year term ending January 14, 2010, he will have been a member of this committee for a total of four and one-half years. This is less than the eight year total allowed for appointees that do not represent a publicly-elected official.

Carmen Urbina was first appointed to this committee on the first of April 2009 and her expiration date was incorrectly stated as December 31, 2012. This expiration date is not in compliance with Lane Manual 3.530 which limits the term of office for a

publicly-elected official or their designee to one year ending on January 14. This error must be corrected.

All commissioner appointees are current members of the CAAC. Each commissioner was sent a packet containing; a letter that defines the role of CAAC and outlines the Lane Manual changes, a Commissioner Appointment form, a Proposed Roster for the Community Action Advisory Committee and copies of the most recently completed application from each of the eight CAAC members. Each commissioner was asked to affirm one member of the committee as their appointee.

Furthermore, the Community Action Advisory Committee reviewed and approved the process used to designate the committee representative/commissioner appointees.

F. Alternatives/Options

- 1. Appoint the proposed nominees to the Community Action Advisory Committee.
- 2. Re-advertise and reopen the selection process for the committee vacancies and commissioner appointees.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommend adoption of option one above.

V. TIMING/IMPLEMENTATION

The nominees will become members of the Community Action Advisory Committee upon Board approval.

VI. FOLLOW-UP

Board approval being received for this appointment, the prospective members will be issued welcome to attend the next CAAC meeting and an orientation to the Community Action Advisory Committee and its budgetary charge.

RE: Application and Resume: Community Action Advisory Committee

1. I believe that my education, employment and advocacy over many years have provided a solid background for membership on the CAAC. Having worked almost exclusively with low-income clients since moving to Oregon in 1972, I understand their oft-times overwhelming needs for economic stability in housing, food, medical care, transportation, and the difficulties they faced in finding suitable employment.

My paralegal work with the Southwestern Oregon Community Action Program in the early 70's led to the discovery of many state workers who were arbitrarily cancelling clients' welfare, food stamps and housekeeper benefits if they had long hair, or a drug conviction. The state hearings officer ordered all of these benefits be restored on a case-by-case basis. My first client was a quadriplegic young man of 21, who lost use of his legs and arms in a diving accident at 18. This man's cash, food stamps, and housekeeper benefits were reinstated at hearing, but before the official written order was received, he took his life. Our office had been caring for him pending the hearing and final order.

While I had planned to move to Eugene to finish studies for a degree in Journalism, and continue on to law school, this earlier work with clients from Coos and Curry Counties signaled the path I should take to continue to assist the disadvantaged. As a private solo practice attorney, both before and following employment as staff attorney with the Public Defender Services of Lane County, Inc. from 1991 - to 2000, I continued to be part-social worker-attorney working for the poor. I referred clients to other local resources for various needs and opportunities, and advocated in the judicial system for a broad understanding of the needs of those in our community who are least able to do so for themselves.

- 2. I would like to become a member of the CAAC to plan for the anticipated large increase in the numbers of residents who will be seeking assistance of various types as our national and local economic recession worsens. While the county could surely benefit from new sources of funding, it appears certain that demands are going to continue to increase at a far faster pace than ever before. We will have to work harder and smarter to be able to offer our disadvantaged citizens the services warranted by their life conditions. The elderly and disabled members of our communities are also of concern; we must do all we can to boost the quality of their daily lives.
- 3. Additionally, I believe the committee should consider all possible avenues to relieve the growing sector of homeless persons. I support the proposition that area shelters should be a priority. Alongside these shelters, the committee should do all it can to boost donations to Food for Lane County, work with local community gardens and other resources to feed, clothe and provide as much health care to this population.
- 4. As a staff attorney with the local public defender office, I served as an appointee to the Public Safety Coordinating Council in the 1990's. I also served on a sub-committee of the PSCC whose charge was to determine the various local programs to fund with a limited budget of county funds.

I have participated in the Lane County Courts Drug Court program as legal representative for the defendants charged with a drug crime, who want to attend treatment. Judge Larson (now retired), a former Deputy District Attorney for Lane County, started our drug court in the 1990's. Besides representing clients in court, It was my job to meet with participants who were having difficulties getting to treatment, or staying off drugs, and to help them determine their personal barriers to treatment. Drug Courts are now offered throughout Oregon, and have been successful.

Most recently, I have attended a Planned Parenthood training to advocate for reproductive rights, including education, contraception, and personal responsibility for young women and girls coming of age in our fairly promiscuous society.

5. I would do everything possible to enlist and encourage broad representation and participation in our volunteer boards and committees, including ensuring that the county gets the word out to those who may be interested in serving, or

participating in a program. I have been impressed with the push for such diversity representation in our county. I favor seeking out those who could contribute or participate.

- 6. I am not serving on any Advisory Boards or Committees.
- 7. I have no personal or family connections with any part of the Lane County contracting, or any other business.
- 8. I heard about this vacancy from Rob Handy, our newly elected county commissioner from North Eugene.
- 9. I reside in the East Lane County District of Lane County.

Finally, I have great interest in serving on the Community Action Advisory Committee. I have always worked for the betterment of the community by aiding its members, whether it be health, safety, emergency resources, or the legal system. I plan to always work for improvement in our responsibility and service to the disadvantaged.

I am available to meet on third Thursdays from noon to 1:30 p.m., and will also be available as needed during budget and planning cycles.

- 1. Experience Please find attached a resume. Included in my 34 years as an educator was working as an At-Risk Counselor at South Eugene High School for 13 years. I was also in charge of substance abuse prevention and intervention. The past 2 years I have worked at Community Rehabilitation Services of Oregon. We provide medical rehabilitation services and vocational placement of persons with brain injury, AD/HD, and other disabilities. I have also worked with several non-profits by placing persons with disabilities in volunteer positions and supervising the clients ability to become competitively employable. I am also co-owner of this business (please see attached pamphlet). I have 4 grown children. Three were adopted when they were 4, 6, and 8 years old. One is a mechanical engineer for a prestigious firm, one works in a sheltered work setting and is mentally ill and the other struggles with addiction. I say this because our family has been personally involved with state and federal aid. I have experienced emotionally what cannot be fully understood intellectually.
- 2. Contribution As an educator, vocational counselor, business person and parent I have done considerable networking in the Human Services community. I want to see data that shows what programs are most effective in our county. I want to be able to compare them to successful programs in other areas. I hope that I can help the committee work creatively to find solutions. I have little tolerance for inequity or inefficiency. I can ask hard questions and make hard decisions. I am able to focus on the big picture and what is best for the long run.

I work with people with disabilities and am very familiar with the American Disabilities Act. I helped develop a week long curriculum for the prevention of AIDS which was gender neutral. I am deeply committed to preventing all types of discrimination.

I began volunteering in human services in this county in 1990, shortly after moving to this community. From 2000-2005, I worked as the Executive Director of Womenspace, Inc., an HSC funded program.
