- 2) What do you want the Board to know about you, your program, your department or your activity?
- 1. The amount of mercury coming through Dorena Dam in one year, according to the Oregon Department of Water Quality, is actually occurring in 3.5 days. This is of grave concern because: (one) my sampling is a conservative estimate for this 3.5 day period, (two) the drinking water of Cottage Grove comes from the Row River 5 miles downstream of Dorena Dam.
- 2. As I have outlined in an email sent to you on September 7, 2009, the Corps of Engineers is required by Oregon Law to either submit a proposal for fish passage or request a waiver.
- 3) What requests have you made to the Board and what is your understanding of the status of these requests? _X__I have no prior requests at this time.
- 4) How have you engaged with other departments, agencies, organizations, or the general public to learn of and consider options that could involve fewer short- or long-term impacts, risks, costs, or bring greater environmental/social benefits or reduce costs I have contacted approximately 60 different groups or individuals. The most recent email (10/18/09) I have sent to you will give you an indication of the diversity of these contacts: ODFW, OWRD, Corps of Engineers, Local Watershed Groups, etc.
- 5) How have you evaluated and compared alternative options with your proposal? (We are particularly interested in any processes you have used to gather diverse input.)
