group to offer input included Linda Cook from LCSO, Scott Beckstead the Sr. State Director for Humane Society of the US, Dr. Kathy Snell who is a local veterinarian who has been deployed nationally as part of federal disaster response teams, and local representative from the American Red Cross.

This plan includes specific procedures for establishing companion animal shelters, livestock shelters, and animal search and rescue procedures. It calls for a system of recruiting and training volunteers in advance, gathering equipment to be ready to respond, and a process for mobilizing to meet the needs of whatever disaster might strike. Now that the plan has been completed, the group is moving forward with communitywide preparedness activities including a January announcement of the plan and community meeting on January 28th to recruit volunteers and discuss training and personal preparedness.

The plan itself is a living document that will include exercises in order to fine tune the County response. Issues that will continue to be addressed by the committee include:

- Working to expand the resources list
- Exploring the appropriate trigger for setting up shelters, and making sure the response is scalable
- Planning for distributing resources for people who can't get out of their home
- Determining levels of training for different types of volunteers
- Disposal of carcasses
- Addressing transportation with pets
- Confirming agreement with Fairgrounds for livestock, and otherwise expand Livestock shelter locations
- EPA sanitation guidelines and how they apply in an emergency?

B. Policy Issues

The Board has developed an Emergency Plan, the annex developed by the task force is a necessary portion of that plan.

C. Board Goals

The work of the committee meets the Board goal of having a plan for preparation and response to major emergencies within Lane County.

D. Financial and/or Resource Considerations

The plan has been developed within existing resources, including many volunteer hours by the community members mentioned above. The community education

WHEREAS, the Oregon Legislature adopted language in 2007 requiring that communities develop plans for animals during a disaster, both for the animal and the owner who might be hesitant to evacuate if there is not a plan to assist with the animal; and

WHEREAS, the plan will be approved as the Animals in Disaster Annex to the Lane County Emergency Operations Plan; and

WHEREAS, a core group of stakeholders including two veterinarians (Drs. Whitlock and Lemhouse), Greenhill Humane Society (Director Lieberman and Dr. Schroder), Public Health Preparedness Coordinator Brian Johnson, and LCAS representatives (Supervisor Howard, Sr. Officers Perkins and Von Stein) developed the plan with help from Dr. Kathy Snell, Linda Cook, and Scott Beckstead; and

WHEREAS, these stakeholders will continue to work with the local community on animal disaster preparedness;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the Lane County Board of Commissioners recognize the members of the Animals in Disaster Task Force for all of the work done to prepare Lane County animals and their owners in the case of a disaster in Lane County.
