I. MOTION:

II. ISSUE

Board approval is required to award a contract for Laurelwood Maintenance Shop and Site Improvements, located in Florence, Oregon.

III. DISCUSSION

A. <u>Background</u>:

The Agency is planning to accomplish the building of a maintenance shop and site improvements in Florence, Oregon. The site improvements include a new playground. This project is the twelfth phase of modernization of the Agency-owned Laurelwood Homes, Florence, Oregon.

The work includes, but is not limited to: excavation, grading, concrete work, rough framing, finish carpentry, rigid and batt insulation, metal flashings, asphalt shingle roofing, aluminum gutters, fiberglass exterior and interior doors, garage doors, plumbing and fixtures, exhaust system, electrical systems and lighting, fire alarm, fencing, playground surface, landscaping.

B. Analysis

A formal bid process with a bid package was issued by the Agency for the required work.. Four bids were obtained, and the lowest bidder is responsive and responsible and they have reviewed their bid and confirmed their costs.

C. <u>Alternatives/Options</u>

In that the public bidding process was employed, the lowest bid has no irregularities and is responsive and responsible, the prices are considered competitive, and there are sufficient budget funds to cover the project, we recommend award of the contract to Meili Construction Co., Inc.

D. Recommendation

E. <u>Timing</u>

Upon bid award, the contractor shall have ten days to provide the Agency with a signed contract. It is anticipated that all other necessary documents could be processed by July 27, 2009 and work would commence shortly thereafter.
