I. **MOTION**

In the Matter of Appointing One Member and Reappointing Three Members to Fill Vacancies on the Mental Health Advisory/Local Alcohol and Drug Planning Committee.

II. **AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY**

The Mental Health Advisory/Local Alcohol and Drug Planning Committee (MHAC/LADPC) LM3.524 seeks to fill four vacancies created by the July 2009 resignation of a member whose term expires on August 31, 2010 and the first term expirations of three current members.

At the time the final draft of this board order was routed, a fifth vacancy was created by a long-time member's resignation. A vacancy notice will be posted within one week and steps taken to solicit applicants.

III. BACKGROUND/IMPLICATIONS OF ACTION

A. Board Action and Other History

A vacancy notice was advertised from July 08, 2009 through August 08, 2009.

At the close of the advertising period, four applications were received. One application was a new applicant and three applications were for reappointment.

The MHAC/LADPC convened a subcommittee and conducted interviews of the four applicants. The MHAC/LADPC herewith nominated the following candidates with extensive backgrounds in alcohol and drug counseling and rehabilitation, developmental disabilities, and mental health issues, and are recommended for appointment and reappointment.

B. Policy Issues

The nominees meet and exceed the minimum qualifications for service on this advisory committee, representing one completion of term for the member who resigned and initiating three second 4-year terms.

C. Board Goals

Meets Board objective of encouraging citizen participation.

D. Financial and/or Resource Considerations

Recruitment for committees represents a significant, ongoing expense for H&HS.

H&HS is very reliant on advisory committees and the pool of applicants, possessing the specialized needs required to adequately staff these committees.

E. Analysis

The nominee possesses an extensive background in alcohol and drug counseling and rehabilitation and has personal experience with developmentally disabled individuals.

F. Alternatives / Options

- 1. Appoint the nominee.
- 2. Reject the nomination and re-post the vacancy.

IV. TIMING/IMPLEMENTATION

If Board approval is received, this new member would be added to the MHAC/LADPC with an effective date of 8/31/2009 to serve completion of term ending on 08/31/2010 and the three reappointed members would begin the second year of their terms beginning on 08/31/2009 and ending on 08/31/2013.

RECOMMENDATION

Both the MHAC/LADPC and Health & Human Services staff approve the nominations proposed above.

FOLLOW-UP

Board approval being received for this appointment, the prospective members would be issued appointment letters and would be invited to attend the MHAC/LADPC annual retreat.

1. Experience and qualifications:

For a number of years I served as a representative for NAMI (the National Alliance for Mental Illness) on the LaneCare Quality Assurance Committee and on its Delivery Systems and Credentialing, Contracting, Consumer Relations subcommittees. Before that, I was a member of the LaneCare ad hoc committee to develop a county public guardianship program. My wife's son suffers from schizophrenia, and for approximately the past twenty years we have had a variety of experiences with the mental health system. My wife and I have been active members of NAMI for many of those years. I have also been a member of the Lane County Mental Health Advisory Committee since 2005 and have chaired its mental health subcommittee for the past year.

I am a retired University of Oregon mathematics professor. During my UO career, I served, often as chairman, on most of the major standing faculty committees, as well as on a number of elected and ad hoc committees at the university and state system levels. In addition, I served as department head and associate dean.

2. Hoped-for contributions:

When I first joined this committee I hoped to bring to the committee the perspective of a concerned family member of a mentally ill adult, and in that way to represent the interests of most NAMI members. I still believe that I can contribute in that way, but I have discovered that as a member of the MHAC I can also help raise awareness of other mental health needs in our community and can, at least in some instances, help to initiate actions to address those needs.

3. Community concerns to address:

I still live in hope of setting up a public guardianship program. Moreover, although we have made some progress this year, there are still serious mental health service gaps at all age levels, from school mental health programs to transition-age youth to geriatric mental health services. In addition, support is lacking for veterans and their families, for members of minority groups—particularly Hispanics—and for people transitioning out of institutional custody. Our subcommittee has been looking at some of these areas and will, I hope, be able to consider more of them in the next few years. I personally am simply interested in doing what I can to improve mental health services for all people in our county.
