I. MOTION

Move approval of the Order.

II. AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY

The Board is being asked to amend Lane Manual 20.17 to exempt ballot counting equipment and software from competitive bidding or quote requirements.

III. BACKGROUND/IMPLICATIONS OF ACTION

A. <u>Board Action and Other History</u>

In 1998, this section was amended to its current verbiage, removing references to polling place signs, sample ballot pages, and labeling of ballot cards since they were no longer applicable with the statewide change to vote-by-mail elections.

D. Financial and/or Resource Considerations

Allowing an exemption to the purchase of the ballot counting equipment and software will allow Elections to go directly to the two vendors certified by the State.

E. Analysis

In Oregon, there are only two ballot counting systems that are currently still in business and certified by the State. They are Hart Intercivic and Election System (ES&S).

Of the 36 counties in Oregon, two have the Hart system, and 32 have ES&S, and one county is in the process of purchasing a new ballot counting system. (Marion County recently sent out an RFP and received bids from only these two vendors.)

Lane County has the Sequoia ballot counting system, which is not going to be supported by that vendor after 2012. Sequoia has informed us that they do not intend to become certified in Oregon due to the high certification cost. It is also not cost effective for them to support only one Oregon customer.

Completing the normal RFP process for election equipment is very time consuming and will not meet the established timeline for replacing the current ballot counting machines and software. Lane County needs a new ballot counting system in place no later than February 1, 2011. This is so the new system can be tested and operational for the next scheduled countywide election in May 2011. (It would not be possible to purchase a new ballot counting system for utilization in the General 2010.)

The ballot counting equipment and software is a specialty item that must meet specific state guidelines and certification requirements for processing ballots. Due to the technical complexity of the equipment and software, there are only a limited number of vendors which meet that requirement and certification. The need to act quickly and to be able to rely on the most dependable vendor is critical. Thus, the purchase of the equipment and software does not lend itself to a competitive process.

The risk of the ballot counting machines failing has increased since the May 18, 2010 Primary election.

Problems experienced with the current ballot counting system which constitute an immediate change.

May 2008 – loss of connectivity to the tabulating console resulting in a restart of the counting machines.

May 2010 – failure of 3 out of 4 ballot counting machines. (The fifth ballot counting machine was not used for this election because it could not pass the required ballot testing. Four counting machines should have been sufficient with the expected voter turnout for this type of election.)

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Approve Option 1 as recommended.

This is being recommended by County Counsel and the Lane County Clerk. This recommendation is being made so that Elections can proceed as quickly as possible with the replacement of the current ballot counting system and software to insure accurate counting for future elections.

V. TIMING/IMPLEMENTATION

This action allows Elections to go directly to the state certified vendors. The sooner we can select a vendor and award a contract, the sooner the ballot counting system can be replaced thus minimizing the complete collapse of the counting machines during an election.

Our goal is to have a contract with a new vendor in place by February 1, 2011 so that the new counting system can be used for a full countywide election in May 2011. This is the only scheduled countywide election in 2011.

VI. FOLLOW-UP

Following committee scoring of vendor responses, a contract will be signed by the vendor and delivered to the County Administration for execution.
