I IN THE MATTER OF ADOPTING  
I LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES PRIOR TO THE 77<sup>TH</sup>  
I LEGISLATIVE SESSION, 2013 REGULAR SESSION

**WHEREAS**, Lane County has a keen interest in state legislative activities, and;

**WHEREAS**, Lane County Government employs an Intergovernmental Relations Manager for the purpose of advocating on behalf of Lane County government at the Oregon Legislature, and;

**WHEREAS**, the Lane County Board of County Commissioners wishes to communicate their legislative priorities to the public and other elected officials, and;

**WHEREAS**, the Legislative Committee is the established standing committee which exists to fully inform the Lane County Board of Commissioners in a timely fashion on legislative issues, and;

**WHEREAS**, it has previously been resolved that the Legislative Committee will forward its recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners for final approval by the Board of County Commissioners on an as-necessary basis.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it resolved that the Lane County Board agrees to the priorities forwarded to it by the Legislative Committee:


- A.) Reduction of discount rate for timely property tax payments made on or before November 15 to provide more local funding to finance county assessment and taxation departments.
- B.) More flexibility of funds for one time use in order to maintain critical services.
- C.) Parents who claim religious exemptions to avoid vaccinating their children must complete a certified educational module.
- D.) Municipal utility's surplus revenue payment to be made to the governing jurisdiction in which its extra-territorial customers reside.
- E.) Real estate seller's property disclosure statement to include representation regarding distance property is located from Goal 5 Mineral and Aggregate inventory land.
- F.) Changes to the state application process for mining to better communicate will of local jurisdictions where mining will occur.
- G.) Authorization for Lane County to use road safety cameras.
- H.) Increase in amount allowed for apportionment by local government of disposal site fees.
- I.) Maximize child support collections at lowest possible cost through local agency authority.
- J.) No published notice requirement for forfeitures of cash and/or property valued under \$1000.00.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this Board Resolution will officially represent the will of the Board of County Commissioners and may be used by the Intergovernmental Relations Manager to communicate their legislative interest to Oregon legislators prior to the 77<sup>th</sup> Legislative Assembly, 2013 Regular Session.
