

Automatic Recount ORS 258.280

1/5th of 1 percent = .002

- When two or more candidates for nomination or office have an equal **and** highest number of votes;

Example:

John Smith	100 votes
Jane Doe	100 votes

OR

- When the difference in the number of votes cast for a candidate with the most votes **and** the votes cast for the closest defeated candidate is not more than one-fifth of one percent of the total votes for **both** candidates.

Example 1:

John Smith	27,415 votes
Jane Doe	27,300 votes

Example 2:

John Smith	27,415 votes
Jane Doe	27,335 votes

Example 1 Formula:

- $27,415 - 27,300 = 115$
- $27,415 + 27,300 = 54,715$
- $115 / 54,715 = .0021$ (**greater than .002, not an automatic recount**)

Example 2 Formula:

- $27,415 - 27,335 = 80$
- $27,415 + 27,335 = 54,750$
- $80 / 54,750 = .00146$ (**less than .002, which qualifies as an automatic recount**)

An automatic recount would not be officially determined until after certification of the election, which occurs by the 20th day after an election.
