Community Health Centers of Lane County- Career and Technical Education Project in South Lane County

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A thriving rural America starts with healthy people, which means providing whole-person care, both directly to patients and through community partners. The mission of the CHCLC is to improve the health and wellness of our community through affordable, holistic healthcare. The new health center will be conducive to offering more resources, proactive educational and prevention programs, and services that support health and wellbeing. To support a team-based approach to integrative care, the new South Lane Clinic will be approximately 8,440 square feet in size to accommodate providers, staff, and patients. Services to include: Family Medicine, Pediatrics, Integrated Behavioral Health, Integrated Oral Health, Gender-affirming Care, Alternative Care, Pharmacist consultations, and 340B program supporting access to low-cost medications. Additional support services include: Insurance and Medicaid enrollment assistance, WIC, Maternal Child Health, a Lab, and Healthy Food pantry area as well as a practicum/hands-on clinical experience for those participating in the Career and Technical Education and Dental Health program through LCC and the South Lane School District. Primary care providers are supported by a trained and dedicated Care Team. Each Care Team consists of a Registered Nurse, Patient Care Coordinator and clinic staff that assist with patient intake procedures. When the South Lane Clinic is fully staffed, two Care Teams are planned to support providers and assist in patient care.
