Smoke and fire respite centers opened today in Eugene and Creswell.

The City of Eugene is opening two community centers for individuals who have compromised respiratory systems and need respite from the wildfire smoke. Petersen Barn and Hilyard Community Centers will serve as daytime Clean Air Centers, opening today, September 9.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic these centers will have limited capacity. Appropriate safety precautions, including physical distancing and sanitation, will be taken to keep patrons and staff safe. No showers are available at the Clean Air Day Centers but charging of electronic devices will be available.

These day centers will remain open for the next two days and may be extended if needed. Please check the City's website for daily updates.

Additionally, Lane County is opening a day center at the Lane Events Center and one in Creswell.

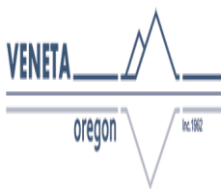
